From Our Rabbi:

Honoring PJ Library, Families, and World Hunger Shabbat, November 4

As a parent, most of us know the challenges of multi-tasking: helping kids with their homework, getting them to ballet or soccer practice, preparing a balanced dinner on time.

Friday, November 4th, 6:30pm: How does one Wilmington Rabbi promote the new Jewish Federation PJ Library, Family-Friendly Shabbat, AND American Jewish World Service World Hunger Shabbat?

Jewish Federation of Delaware Staffer and Beth Shalom Member Elisha Caplan figured it out: "Rabbi, why don't you read *Bagels from Benny* for your sermon?" Brilliant. The story, rooted in the ancient folktales of Spain, introduces young readers to young Benny, who places a bag of his grandpa's bagels in the synagogue's ark before Shabbat in gratitude to God. He is delighted to see them vanish every week and is shaken and later enlightened when he learns what really happens to the bagels. (The formal PJ Library kickoff will be held on **Sunday, November 13, 10:30am**, at the new Delaware Children's Museum at the Riverfront.)

While young *shul*-goers learn about hunger from a child's point-of-view, adults will walk out of November 4th's services with material prepared by the American Jewish World Service (AJWS), in order to continue home-based hunger sensitivity projects in the 18-day lead up to Thanksgiving. World Hunger Shabbat was announced in Delaware by AJWS Executive Director Ruth Messinger. Along with U.S. Senator Chris Coons, Ms. Messinger was one of Jewish Federation's key note speakers for last month's Bagels and Briefing at the Siegel JCC (thus bringing our bagel-theme full circle).

On the **Tuesday preceding Thanksgiving, November 22, at 7:30pm**, there will be an Interfaith Thanksgiving Celebration at Peninsula McCabe United Methodist Church, at 2200 Baynard Blvd. We will be celebrating, Jews, Christians and Muslims, exploring sacred texts on Gratitude and our Obligation to the Hungry, as we also seek volunteers to prepare taxes for the working poor, mentor our inner city youth at Warner Elementary on 18th Street, and replenish food supplies at Hanover Food Pantry, which is struggling to meet the needs of the hungry in the Ninth Ward. Be sure to bring in non-perishable canned food items and place them in the Hanover Food Pantry Bin located on the far side of the atrium every time you visit Congregation Beth Shalom.

Giving Our Children a Strong Jewish Identity

As a congregation, as parents and grandparents, and as part of the Jewish people we want our children to acquire a strong Jewish identity. That's a powerful reason to join a synagogue and send your children to Hebrew School. Families and the school work in partnership to provide the "book learning", the discussions, the celebrations and practice at home and in the synagogue, and the shared aspects of Jewish observance that will shape the identity for the next generation.



The recent High Holy Days are a case in point. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are more synagogue-based than holidays such as Chanukah or Pesach. Regardless of how long children stayed in services, or whether they were in the main service or one of our wonderful children's services, they heard the sound of the shofar and the distinctive holiday melodies. Even the young children who came to Tashlich could absorb the idea of getting rid of bad behaviors by the experience of throwing bread into the water. Children could see many people, including clergy, wearing white clothing and non-leather shoes. Dipping apples in honey or eating the round raisin challah is a way to experience the sweetness of the New Year, much better than just reading about a holiday in class.

Children imitate what they see around them, but they have to understand it at an age-appropriate level. So . . . how do we explain the *al chet* recitation of sins? These lists contain long, hard-to-understand descriptions of negative behaviors, some of which we don't even begin to explain to the children. But children DO understand the concepts of trying to get rid of bad behaviors and substitute better behaviors in the New Year. Here is the alphabetical list of negative and positive actions that the children put together for their own *al chet*.

Still Creating Memories

It was December 1962.

My parents drove my older sister, Carol, to Newark Airport, and they brought me along for the ride. Carol was leaving for Chicago to attend the international USY (United Synagogue Youth) convention, along with around 200 other USY members from northern New Jersey. She would be the first person in our immediate family to travel by air. After the group checked in they gathered together for some final instructions before heading to their departure gate. After a few minutes one of the USYers began the regional cheer and song and then, without any warning, they began singing and dancing, right there in the terminal, in plain sight of hundreds of other passengers. It felt like the floor was vibrating from their incredible spirit.

Looking back on that evening, almost 50 years ago, I have to say that was when I wanted to be part of USY. Nine months later, I attended my first USY meeting at Temple Emanuel in Paterson, New Jersey.

Just two years later, it was my turn. My parents drove me to the same airport on a cold, foggy December day. We were on a charter flight operated by TWA. By this point, as a tenth grader, I already was a seasoned USYer with friends from various communities in New Jersey.

This was the first time I had ever boarded an airplane. The prop jet didn't even have tray tables. We ate our frozen Lou G. Siegel kosher meals on pillows on our laps. I still remember some of the people who were on that flight. (In fact, some are still my friends.) One became a well known Hollywood comedy writer, another a prominent rabbi. At least two others became synagogue presidents and presidents of Schechter day schools. Others are now attorneys, teachers, and physicians.

I doubt that any of us have forgotten that experience.

The details of the opening session are still fresh in my mind. Fourteen hundred USYers and staff gathered in the basement exhibit hall of the Conrad Hilton Hotel (now the Chicago Hilton and Towers). The noise was deafening. The ruach was incredible. I had never experienced such intense excitement.

I have been to every international USY convention since 1964. The excitement never wears off. It never gets old. Even though I know what to expect the experience still moves me to tears. Each time I stand on the dais at the opening session of the convention I am in awe. Back in 1964 I never could have dreamed that I would have the opportunities and experiences that have filled my life ever since.

A few years ago we asked a group of about 100 regional USY officers and international board members to tell us what they liked best about USY. Many spoke about the friends they had met, others about the unique community they were able to create, still others about USY being a safe space where they could be themselves and still be accepted. As I read their responses I realized that much of what they found in USY was no different from what had been so appealing to me so many years ago.

I still have close friends I met in USY. Like so many other people, I met my wife because of USY. I have many USY acquaintances I encounter from time to time. We find that we share a unique bond of shared experiences. Today's USYers continue to create their own special Jewish community, in much the same way that we did. As I travel from region to region I look forward to sharing Kabbalat Shabbat services, the ruach at Shabbat dinner, and the special slow songs of the final Shabbat meal, seudah shlishit. At spring conventions, graduating seniors still cry at havdalah, just as we did, because they know they are leaving their special warm caring community and that they will have to find or create new communities where they can thrive as Jews.

As parents, my wife Yehudis and I looked on with pride and joy as our four children had their own unique USY experiences and helped to create their own USY communities. Although they are well beyond their USY years, each of them continues to contribute to USY as staff or as volunteers. They, too, have their own special USY memories. Before we know it, in another nine or ten years, it will be our grandson Lev's turn. He and his friends undoubtedly will create a caring community that will inspire lasting memories.

Jules Gutin joined United Synagogue's staff in 1971, and since 1991 he has been the director of USY.
